Also, when we call you 3 times in the first year post discharge, please call back and let us know how you are doing — meeting? Sponsor? Step work? Working with others? Outpatient program/ counseling? Sober living/halfway house? Alumni meetings? Etc? Please let us know and if we may be of assistance to you.

As far as the first reunion that didn't happen yet, I guess we can consider it a dry run for the one planned September 25—27, 2009. I hope we see you here. I appreciate those of you who followed through on your reservations and plans in spite of the cancellation and had fun in the Hill Country with friends anyway. I was disappointed the Reunion was cancelled but it was best to err on the side of caution with a view to responsibility for our patients, alumni and staff.
